IMPORTANT NEWS : CYCLONE DEBBIE AND LOCAL WET WEATHER UPDATE

Consistent heavy rainfall throughout NSW for the past month and the flow on effect from Cyclone Debbie in QLD will have a devastating impact to most of our growing areas over Autumn and Winter.

The immediate short fall in supply is because the growers cannot physically get into the paddocks to harvest what is not damaged and transport it to Sydney Markets to be sold.

Lines that have been impacted immediately include sweet potato, lemons, avocadoes, zucchini flowers and all herbs. The flow on impact will be from the damage sustained to young crops and seedlings that were set in the ground ready for June, July and August. The inability of the Growers to replant over the next 3–4 weeks will also have a detrimental affect.

Lines that we predict will be very short in supply and high in price over the winter months include tomatoes, Roma tomatoes, capsicum, beans, corn, zucchini and some pumpkin crops. It is still early days and as more information becomes apparent we will keep you posted.
